

COVID-19 symptoms and isolation: quick guide

Clarification that the 10-day isolation period: The period starts the day after *the first symptoms / the test if there's no symptoms / contact with a confirmed case.* This means that if, for example, your 10-day isolation period starts on the 15th of the month, your isolation period ends at 23:59 hrs on the 25th and you can return to your normal routine.
