Well done Team LPPS – you are all amazing.

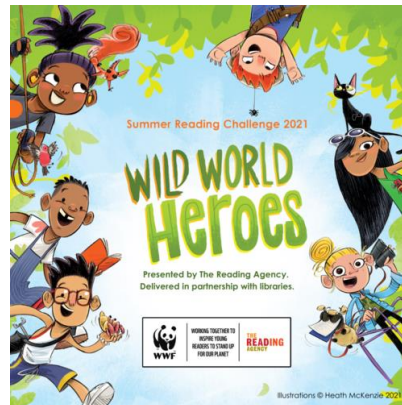
Now we rest, ready to do it all again next year.

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## Uniform

### **20% off M&S School Uniform, excluding accessories, from 6th July to 3rd August**

We have been fully understanding with items of uniform that have been replaced by non-uniform items in the last two terms. This has been in light of the pandemic and the need to minimise trips to the shops and replacing items that the children have grown out of.

**When we return in September the expectation is that all children are in full, correct school uniform.**

Children will still come into school in PE kit on PE days as this has proven to maximise PE lesson time and reduce lost property!

As you prepare for the purchase of new school uniform for September, here are some reminders for our soon to be Year 3 children.

#### **Key Stage 2 Uniform**

**Winter:** Grey skirt or trousers, white plain shirt, navy blue knitted cardigan with school logo, or navy-blue knitted jumper with school logo and school tie (compulsory).

**Summer:** Grey shorts, white plain shirt navy blue and white checked gingham dress.

Backpack (KS2 only)

**PE KIT:** House colour T-shirt with school logo, navy blue shorts or shorts with school logo, navy tracksuit bottoms or tracksuit bottoms with school logo, optional fleece with school logo and **trainers**. There is a larger PE bag available for Key Stage 2 pupils.

Hawksbrook – yellow

Eden – green

Wickham – blue

Harvington – red
